

Shrubs for Special Purposes

Shrubs and trees can be found growing in a wide variety of soil and site conditions. Different varieties of shrubs can be found growing in locations ranging from very wet to very dry, from very low pH to a very high pH and from very exposed and sunny sites to dense shade. If you have a yard with a special problem situation, it is important to select a shrub that will grow and even thrive under those conditions.

Shrubs for Moist Soils

Although it is usually advisable to try to drain areas where water stands for any length of time, the following shrubs will withstand moist soil conditions better than most.

- Yellowtwig Dogwood (*Cornus s.* 'Flaviramea')

- Pussy Willow (*Salix caprea*)
